One of our most unique assets, the Palm Springs Air Museum, showcases the history of military and aviation in Palm Springs and includes the opportunity to ride in classic airplanes including a T-28 Trojan and a P-51 Mustang.

Our outdoor beauty is unparalleled as a result of being surrounded by the San Jacinto and San Bernadino mountain ranges. Hiking, mountain biking, and trail running opportunities abound with 100s of miles of easy to difficult trails. The bravest can tackle the Cactus to Cloud hike, a 21-mile grueling hike from the desert floor to the peak of San Jacinto. An easier go is to take a ride on the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway, a 10-minute, 2.5-mile ride up to 8,800 ft. From there, you can hike to the peak of San Jacinto at nearly 11,000 feet.

We are committed to working closely with you to ensure a seamless and unforgettable conference experience.
